PURPOSE

To brief the National Council of Provinces on the intervention measures implemented by the Department of Community Safety and Transport Management to mitigate the impact of Covid-19 within the Public Transport Services in the Province.





BACKGROUND

- ☐ The announcement of a lockdown in March 2020, took the country and transport industry by surprise and operation were minimal or at a stand still.
- ☐ For a period of two months operations for small bus operators contracted to provide learner transport came to a standstill as schools were closed
- ☐ Subsidised bus operators only stopped operations for a month.





BACKGROUND

- ☐ Department engaged with all bus operators to check their preparedness to resume operations
- ☐ Small bus operators were given first priority with assistance of disinfectants, sanitisers and face shield as only Grade 7 & 12 learners were returning to school.
- ☐ Their operations were to use only 358 buses to ferry the learners to school.





DISCUSSION

- □ A consignment of PPE's was further supplied by Department of Transport (DoT) to assist public transport operators.
- □ This was again used to supply the small bus operators with sanitisers, disinfectants and face shields when more buses returned to operations.
- □ All operators 195, at the time, and 681 bus drivers were supplied with the PPE's
- ☐ Currently the Department has appointed 63 monitors to assist in ensuring compliance and others will be appointed this financial year.

DISCUSSION

- ☐ DoT further through a letter instructed all Provincial Departments to reprioritise 5% of the PTOG Budget for procurement of PPE's for public transport operators.
- ☐ This was done to assist all operators with PPE's but due to having not assisted subsidised operators, they were then prioritised.
- □ All four operators were assisted as per slide below:
