BACKGROUND

- According to the mid- year estimates 2021 from Stats-SA released in July 2021 Mpumalanga has an estimated population of **4 743 584**
- The targeted COVID-19 vaccination population starts from 18 years and above
- The province is having **3 050 289** of the eligible population to be vaccinated
- For the province to realize the 67% herd immunity, it needs to vaccinate a population of 2 043 694
- As of 28rd August 2021 the province had vaccinated a total cumulative number of **538 320**
- / 3 050 289 eligible population which is 17,7%

Nkangala District is the district that is pulling the performance of the province down one of the contributory factors is inadequate Staff in their health facilities due to financial constraints and also most of the working group access services in Gauteng as is next to their work-stations.

PHASE 2 COVID-19 VACCINE ROLL-OUT UPTAKE (60 and above)

- Vaccine uptake for age band >60 years was launched on 17 May 2021.
- As of the 28 August 2021 a total of 199 279 / 381 716 has been registered while 228
 837 were vaccinated
- The highest performing district is Nkangala with 67.4 %, this can be due the high number of old age homes where the targeted population is confined in one place at the same time.
- Three of the local municipalities in Nkangala that have exceeded the 67% coverage of the age group population that is Emakhazeni, Steve Tshwete and Thembisile Hani having recorded 133,86%; 81,78% and 68,60% respectively.
- Furthermore, Ehlanzeni district has performed well in this age group is related to high number rural areas governed by traditional authorities. Having two of the local municipalities exceeded 67% (**Bushbuckridge recorded 86,85% and Nkomazi 68,17%**)

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- Vaccine uptake for age band 50-59 years was launched on 15 July 2021.
- A total of 113 911/ 348 796 have been registered while 98 291 (28 August 2021) were vaccinated
- Gert Sibande is the best performing district in this age group
- While the lowest performing district in this age band is Nkangala this can be due to this age band working in Gauteng and accessing vaccination service closer to their work-stations





PFIZER AND JOHNSON & JOHNSON COVID-19 VACCINE ROLL-OUT UPTAKE 35-49 YEARS (SUMMARY)

- Vaccine uptake for age band 35-49 years was launched on 01 August 2021.
- A total of 197 758/ 1 356 471 have been registered while 102 758 (28 August 2021) were vaccinated.
- Even in this age group Gert Sibande is the best performer at 11.3%
- The lowest performing district is Nkangala at 5.8 % in this age band this might be related to border issues as most of the population works and use services from both Gauteng and Limpopo

Vaccine uptake for age band 18-34 years was launched on 20 August 2021. A total of **57 340/ 963 306** have been registered while **18 483** (28 August 2021) were vaccinated and we are still continuing with the programme. This is a new age band recently introduced, and we are continuing with demand creation





COVID-19 VACCINATION IN MINES, FARMS AND FORESTRY

- The department visited mines, power stations, farms and forestry and managed to vaccinate the following: (data is included in the total vaccinated)
- Ehlanzeni district
 - Mines: 405
 - Farms: 2 823
 - Forestry: **155**

Gert Sibande district

- Mines: 2 585
- Farms: **3 069**
- Forestry: 663
- Nkangala district
 - o Mines: 3 449
 - Power stations: **1 202**

KEY CHALLENGES

- Inadequate number of staff in all health facilities leading to reduced capacity to increase vaccination coverage
- Low uptake of vaccine in all prioritized age bands particularly age 50-59 years and 35-49 years
- Poor connectivity in rural areas resulting in delay in the registration
- Paper base registration result in disparities on EVDS which distort of numbers in the province
- Anti-vaccine narrative on social media leading to vaccine hesitancy





KEY INTERVENTIONS

- Increase work force to improve vaccine roll out programme. The following cadres were appointed:
 - **175** Professional Nurses (vaccinators)
 - **486** data capture for EVDS
 - **60** Enrolled Nursing Assistants for screening and vital signs
- Increase fixed vaccination sites from 20 to 60 sites while continuing with daily community outreach
- Continue with the vaccination programme at SASSA pay points and taxi ranks
- Partnering with TVETs, Mpumalanga University, TUTs and DOE
- Integrate COVID-19 vaccination services into the existing health services in all health facilities including Mobile Clinic
- Expand vaccination point at strategic areas such as shopping malls especially on busy days (month end and long weekend)
- Expand community loud hailing by hailing three days before outreach team visit the site to raise awareness on vaccination activities
- Each sub-district has allocated two (02) data capture with a target of 100 paper base per day to address the back log of paper registration last day of the project is 31 August 2021





VACCINATION PROGRAMME EXPANSION PLAN

Strategy focus	Activities
Political Leadership	 MEC Vaccine drives: Shopping malls, taxi ranks, sporting clubs e.g. Bikers Premier, MEC's and Executive Mayors to monitor vaccination programs
Mining sector	 Continue with collaboration with all mines and power stations within each district to upscale vaccination
Traditional Authorities and Religious leaders	 Continue with outreach to traditional authorities and Religious gatherings Partnering with headman (Indunas) in traditional authorities on demand creation and vaccination to increase uptake
Farms & Forestry	 Continue with vaccination outreach to all farms and forestry in each district to increase vaccine uptake

Misconceptions addressed	 Provide continuous health education on COVID 19 and vaccine safety and benefits at community level using radio talk shows , poster in communities and social media platforms. Conduct community interaction talk-shows to address the myths and misconceptions around vaccines Need to have J&J to increase the uptake 			
Community buy-in	 Collaborate with stakeholders at community level (NGOs, Civil societies, ward counsellors etc.) to assist with public trust building and community engagement. Continue to collaborate with command councils at all levels to get obtain community by-ins, address misconceptions and allay anxieties
