1. BACKGROUND

Parliament of the Republic of South Africa makes use of print media to advertise its programmes and activities, as one part of a communication mix aimed at better public awareness, reputation building, trust and confidence building as well as citizen and stakeholder engagement and participation in achieving its vision. Parliament therefore seeks to appoint a service provider to provide comprehensive advertisement placement services for Parliament of the Republic of South Africa. This has to be done in a manner that enables bulk buying of advertising space in various print media, and utilization of economies of scale to ensure more cost effective use of its advertising revenue.

In the past 3 years, Parliament advertised mainly in the Johannesburg weekend newspapers and on limited basis Johannesburg dailies and weekend tabloids. The weekend newspapers are printed on spreadsheet format. On average Parliament places 15 advertisements a month in these newspapers. Parliament intends to spread its reach by also advertising in lower Living Standard Measurements (LSM) audience, regional and local newspapers available in other provinces and municipalities as per its communications strategy and the Programme of Action.

2. OBJECTIVES

The broad objectives of this RFQ include:

- To provide prospective service providers with adequate information to understand and respond to Parliament's requirements;
- To ensure that responses from prospective service providers comply with determined standards; and
- To provide a structured framework for the evaluation of proposals.

3. Purpose of the Request For RFQ

The purpose of the terms of reference (TOR) is to identify a suitably qualified service provider with the requisite capacity to provide advertisement placement services for a period of six (6), as per the scope of the required service.

The service provider must execute this project in a manner that meets the desired standards, quality, scope, timeframe and cost for Parliament.

All bids that fail to attach the required documents will be disqualified.
