

## WORK EXPERIENCE

As the President, Lwando was responsible for chairing the weekly SRC executive meetings, monthly SRC meetings, and monthly SRC-Rectorate Meetings and representing students in the Quarterly Council Meetings. The role of the President was to enable communication between relevant student leaders and activists and relay challenges to senior management. For example, students had food security challenges, and the SRC and Management were able to help with food vouchers.

This involved attending donor funding meetings, writing meeting minutes and monthly reports, and identifying potential donors and projects for the company. The role of the Ward Councillor is to act as a liaison between the residents and stakeholders of the ward and the municipality. This is achieved through monthly ward committee meetings, quarterly public meetings, and council meetings. The Ward Councillor also assists residents in reporting service delivery issues and advocates for the developmental needs of the ward in the Integrated Development Plan (IDP) and budget processes. For instance, when the ward faced a crime challenge, Lwando worked with the municipality to improve lighting, install cameras, and increase law enforcement patrols.

The MMC of Corporate Services is tasked with leading the Local Labour Forum (LLF), which convenes monthly to address and improve labour-related issues. This forum allows the municipality to collaborate with unions and has successfully prevented strikes within the municipality. Furthermore, the MMC oversees capital expenditure and ensures the directorate's implementation of the Integrated Development Plan (IDP).
