Given that nine months ago The Presidency handed over 500 companies to the National Treasury for potential blacklisting following extensive corruption and fraud investigations by the Special Investigating Unit, but only a mere 18 entities have been successfully restricted, leaving 491 companies still under review and still winning government tenders, what are the full details of the (a) policy and/or legislative provisions that the National Treasury relies on in allowing such companies to bid for government contracts and (b) time frame of the reviews for either blacklisting or clearing the companies?
