With reference to the estimated 50-60% drop-out rate amongst first-year students at universities in South Africa, what measures are currently being implemented to ensure that such students are retained in the Higher Education system?

*Accountability of college/university councils***★11. Mr M Feni (Eastern Cape: ANC) to ask the Minister of Higher Education:**

- (1) Whether his department has any plans to (a) monitor, (b) evaluate and (c) hold members of college and university councils accountable; if not, why not; if so, what plans;
- (2) what consequence management measures are in place where Executives and Councils are found to have committed serious failures whether by omissions and/or commission in their duties such as the case at the College of Cape Town?

Whether he has been informed that the management of the National Student Financial Aid Scheme student accommodation continues to deteriorate, particularly regarding the accreditation of buildings that allegedly fail to comply with the prescribed norms and standards; if not, what is the position in this regard; if so, (a) what (i) monitoring and (ii) verification processes are currently in place to ensure that only compliant, safe and habitable accommodation is accredited, (b) how many non-compliant buildings have been accredited since 2023 and (c) what consequence management has been instituted against officials who are responsible for approving such buildings?

- (2) how many institutions in each province have introduced new programmes in renewable energy, digital economy, artificial intelligence, green hydrogen, maritime economy, agriculture processing and other scarce skills sectors in the past 24 months;
- (3) (a) how many TVET colleges in (i) KwaZulu-Natal and (ii) the Eastern Cape are fully equipped to deliver artisanal training that is aligned to infrastructure and energy transition projects and (b) what percentage of graduates secure employment within 12 months as disaggregated in each province? *Milestones in advancing reforms***★157. Mr M Billy (KwaZulu-Natal: DA) to ask the Minister of Home Affairs:**

(a) What key milestones and measurable progress has his department achieved in advancing reforms such as strengthened border enforcement, increased deportations and rollout of digital systems, including the Intelligent Population Register and Digital ID in light of Cabinet's approval of the Revised White Paper on Citizenship, Immigration and Refugee Protection which represents a major overhaul of South Africa's immigration system and (b) how such reforms position South Africa to better attract investment, skilled workers and economic growth while safeguarding the integrity of the country's borders? *Organised systemic corruption***★151. Ms O D Medupe (North West: ANC) to ask the Minister of Home Affairs:**

Whether his department is making any progress in addressing organised systemic corruption that is involving syndicates, particularly by foreign nationals and complicit officials; if not, why not; if so, (a) what progress and (b) what measures are in place to strengthen its internal organisational capacity to detect, identify and pre-empt fraudulent issuing of passports, identity documents, visas and work, residence and study permits? *Idutywa Department of Home Affairs***★144. Ms A Matshobeni (Eastern Cape: EFF) to ask the Minister of Home Affairs:**

Whether he has been informed of the ongoing service disruptions at the Idutywa Department of Home Affairs office which have persisted for approximately three months as the mobile service unit that has been deployed to the area is currently non-functional as a result of the lack of electricity; if not, what is the position in this regard; if so, what measures are in place to resolve issues at the said facility to ensure restoration of essential services to the community? *Border Management Authority***★147. Mr H J Van den Berg (Northern Cape: FF Plus) to ask the Minister of Home Affairs:**

- (1) Whether the Border Management Authority (BMA) is now fully electronically (a) activated and (b) connected at all ports of entry; if not, why not; if so, what is the status of the (i) Enhanced Movement Control System 2.0, (ii) facial recognition system and (iii) Electronic Travel Authorisation system;
- (2) what is the current status of integration of the BMA with other entities, particularly the SA Police Service and the remaining functions of his department;
- (3) whether he will provide any available information and statistics on (a) the effectiveness of the BMA and (b) his department's border management initiatives, including (i) prevention of illegal crossings, (ii) tourist arrivals and (iii) the overall impact on national security; if not, why not; if so, what are the relevant details?
