- (2) whether such challenges improve or worsen during section 139 interventions; if not, what is the position in this regard; if so, (a) what are the noticeable trends and (b) what key impediments his department has identified with regard to Misa projects during section 139 interventions? CO975E

Systemic/institutional gaps on initiation schools

(a) What specific systemic and institutional gaps have been identified by his department that allowed 58 illegal initiation schools to open, register and operate undetected by law enforcement and oversight structures, given the “preventable” tragic loss of 43 initiates during the recent winter initiation season which occurred despite the existence of the Customary Initiation Act, 2021 (Act No. 2 of 2021), and established Initiation Structures and (b) what factors contributed to the unprecedented surge to 18 fatalities in Mpumalanga that allowed it to surpass the historically high-risk provinces like the Eastern Cape with recorded 14 deaths?
