★1. Mr T Makondo (ANC) to ask the Deputy President:

In light of his social cohesion responsibilities, (a) what has been his finding with regard to violence against women and its effect on their ability to participate actively in the mainstream economy and (b) what is the Government doing to ensure that women do not feel alienated, but regard themselves as protected partners in the social cohesion and nation-building projects? ★2. Mr J H Steenhuisen (DA) to ask the Deputy President:

Whether he has engaged any organised segments of society in pursuit of his responsibility as champion of moral regeneration initiatives, since he was sworn in as Deputy President of the Republic on 27 February 2018; if not, why not; if so, what are the relevant details? NO814E

★3. Mr N F Shivambu (EFF) to ask the Deputy President:

In view of illicit financial flows and profit shifting by which mining and other corporations erodes the economic base, reduces the public purse and impacts on the Government's ability to eradicate unemployment, inequality and poverty, what steps

In light of the significance of the human resource development strategy in the provision of opportunities for people to develop themselves, improve the quality of their lives and their standard of living and the fact that the Government has resolved to implement fee-free quality education for students from poor households to prepare individuals to participate in the economy and raise their standard of living, in what manner will the provision of free quality education contribute to the Human Development Strategy of the country? - (1) Whether, in view of his responsibility to champion social cohesion in the country, he intends to convey a message to China with regard to its alleged continued interference in domestic issues of the Department of Home Affairs and by allegedly seeking to regulate and mobilise protest on university campuses against visiting persons of Tibetan origin; if so, what are the relevant details; if not,
- (2) whether he finds that China's alleged subversive conduct undermines the sovereign authority of the Republic; if not, what is his position in this regard; if so, what steps he intends to take? NO218E

★6. Mr A M Shaik Emam (NFP) to ask the Deputy President:

With reference to the position of the President of the Republic, Mr C M Ramaphosa on radical economic transformation as expressed in the State of the Nation Address on Friday, 16 February 2018, what are the timeframes that the Government envisages for radical economic transformation that will ensure returning the land, protecting the mineral wealth and improving the socio-economic conditions to achieve a better quality of life for all the people?
