

PRESENTATION BY PREMIER DUKWANA, ON THE OCCASION OF THE NCOP'S THREE SPHERE PLANNING SESSION, ON THE 29^{TH} , MARCH, 2023, CAPE TOWN, SOUTH AFRICA

Theme: Delineating Key Priorities For Consolidation and Implementation During The Final Year Of The Sixth Dispensation:

29 TO 30 MARCH 2023

Honourable Members.

Our urge to build a capable, ethical and developmental state, remains a constant of our revolution.

In the next fourteen (14) months, decisive steps will be taken, to make the Free State, a province of a confluence of possibilities. The key priorities are to ensure that:

- Our People live in quality houses;
- Our Children play and learn in safe environments;
- Our healthcare facilities provide quality services; and
- Every person has equal access to opportunities and more importantly, we strive for substantive equality, beyond formal equality; informed by our pursuit of socioe-economic rights.

To achieve the broad key priorities as outlined above, the following key milestones will attract urgent attention:

Our People live in quality houses:

- Completing the 11 000 incomplete houses and resolving the blocked projects in partnership with the National Home Builders Registration Council;
- Accelerating integrated housing through the revival of the Phakisa Mega and the QwaQwa Gateway projects and, completing the Vista Park Presidential project;
- Embarking on **Alternative Building Technologies** within our settlements; that were identified as emergency areas
- Working with the Development Bank of Southern Africa, as an implementing agent for the removal and replacement of asbestos roofing in about 36 000 houses across the province.
- Upgrading of the registered 166 informal settlements. The improvement package includes the provision of basic services, access to amenities and security of tenure.

- Campaign to accelerate the issuing of title deeds will commence next month, to ensure the security of tenure for home owners.
- Eradicate the Bucket system. A progress report compiled in August 2022, revealed that there were over 10 000 unconnected toilets in areas such as Clocolan, Ficksburg, Senekal, Reitz, Petrus Steyn, Arlington and Dealesville.
- We will direct the **Mangaung Metropolitan Municipality** to address **sanitation challenges**, particularly in **Botshabelo**.
- Government has equally prioritized dysfunctional waste water treatment plants. Work in affected areas and this will extend to Maluti-a- Phofung.

Our Children play and learn in safe environments:

- Community Nutrition Development Centres are committed to ensuring access to safe and nutritious food. We will continue to provide access to food and developmental programmes to 7 406 poor and vulnerable persons, who benefit on a daily basis from our 55 Centres in the province.
- School Nutrition Programme that enhances learning and teaching in schools will be extended to 600 176 learners this year.
- Prioritising school safety will require a collaboration between the SAPS with designated patrols to schools, school management, SGBs and school safety committees. Schools must be weapon-free and drug-free.
- Prioritize the finalization of the Provincial Integrated Crime and
 Violence Prevention Strategy. We commend the SAPS for the work

that they are doing; often in very challenging circumstances. **Community Policing Forums** will be strengthened to work with the **SAPS** to combat crime in our communities.

Our healthcare provides quality services:

We aim to:

Strengthen our primary health care facilities and services, including specifically pre- and ante-natal care. This will be achieved through: **Reduce queues** at **Primary Healthcare** facilities through the use of alternative chronic medication distribution channels.

- o Increase the immunisation coverage for children between6 months and 15 years.
- Expand the roll-out of session doctors at Primary Health
 Care facilities.
- o Do an outreach by **District Health Services**; up to to **Primary Health Care** facilities. We intend to attract more doctors through this mechanism.
- o The refurbishment and expansion of **clinic infrastructure**, to implement **the National Health Insurance**.
- o **Resource clinics** with human capital, equipment, medicine and consumables.

The following Health Infrastructure Projects will start in the 2023/24 financial year:

- o Dihlabeng Regional Hospital smart revitalization in Bethlehem
- o Construction of New Dinaane Clinic in Thaba Nchu

- o Construction of new Vaalrock Clinic in Winnie Mandela
- o Construction of new Bophelong Clinic in Kroonstad
- o Upgrade of JD Newberry Hospital in Clocolan
- o Upgrade of Lesedi Clinic in Harrismith
- o New Gariepdam Clinic in Gariep

Every person has equal access to opportunities:

To guarantee both formal and substantive equality, we strive for:

- Review of the Free State Growth and Development Strategy, to enhance prospects of economic growth and development.
- The undertaking of a substantial review of the current state of our public entities and, reposition them to be responsive to the developmental agenda.
- The revitalization of our Industrial Parks. Priority areas remain Botshabelo, Phuthaditjhaba and Thaba Nchu. We anticipate to conclude new agreements with private sector investors in the cement and concrete, textile and dry-powder food manufacturing sectors.
- Increasing of our tourism market share, through destination marketing, product development and promotion.
- Food Security efforts, to supplement a new concept the Production Brigade, that will be exploring with the Department of Defense and Military Veterans and, the South African National Defense Force agricultural products; leading up to agro-processing.
- Determination of the feasibility of the Maluti-a-Phofung
 Alternative Energy Solution, to construct solar plants in QwaQwa

- and Tshiame, and the Electricity Upgrades and Remedial Work to improve the network.
- Determining the feasibility of the Mangaung Airport Development
 Node project valued at over R10 billion which will provide residential units, retail areas, conference facilities, office space and a hotel.
- Structuring and design of the Sasolburg Integrated and Mixed
 Housing Development project valued at over R8 billion. This
 project will integrate Sasolburg and Vanderbijlpark as part of the
 envisaged Vaal River City Region between the two towns.
- The multibillion Rand Virginia Gas project by Renergen, is beginning to change our economic fortunes. A feasibility study will be undertaken for the creation of a Special Economic Zone to maximize beneficiation from the gas extraction and related industries in the Virginia area.
- The Thaba 'Nchu Smelter, currently under construction, will change the economic landscape of this area. This project, with an estimated value of R300 million, will create 2 000 permanent jobs when completed around the first quarter of the new financial year.
- Work with the Department of Mineral Resources to support small-scale miners. The award of mining permits to artisanal miners will be pursued. This intervention will help to curb illegal mining activities, and will usher in a new dawn in this industry in the province.
- The deteriorating state of our road infrastructure, is a stumbling block for economic development. We will spend approximately R1.9 billion on upgrading and maintaining the road infrastructure this year. We

- will explore the implementation of solutions, such as the 24-hour road construction.
- Expedite the maintenance and construction backlog, of roads that form the backbone of the logistics industry and support economic activity, such as the roads in the Ficksburg and Bothaville areas.
 R1 billion, has been prioritized, for the following roads:
 - Ladybrand Bethlehem (R26 road)
 - o Ficksburg Rosendal (R70 road)
- Our investment in the roads infrastructure in the upcoming Financial Year, will comprise:
 - o R771 million in Thabo Mofutsanyana.
 - o R220 million in Fezile Dabi.
 - o R217 million in Xhariep.
 - o R165 million in Mangaung and,
 - o R125 million in Lejweleputswa.
- the Township Revitalization Programme focused on the upgrading of gravel to paved roads. The focus has been on township roads in 14 townships. Nine of these projects will be completed at the end of March and the remaining roads will be completed at the end of May. The next phase of the Programme will focus on township roads in QwaQwa, Bethlehem, Bloemfontein, Botshabelo, Thaba Nchu, Sasolburg, Kroonstad Ficksburg, Harrismith, Ladybrand and Paul Roux.

- An amount of R150 million, is budgeted for the re-gravelling programme, in all five districts.
- Enhancing Operation Vala Zonke initiatives to eradicate potholes. Our focus must be multi-pronged; include the private sector and the rebuilding of capacity within the public sector. We will draw on the capacity developed through various Contractor Development Programmes, to accelerate the expansion of the repair of potholes in our municipal spaces. Municipalities will be required to develop, fund and implement pothole eradication programmes.
- We continue to place high value on the delivery of quality education infrastructure. Eleven new schools are currently under construction in the province:
 - o Trompsburg Special School in Xhariep
 - o Tlholo Primary School in Motheo
 - o Arbeidsgenot Primary School in Motheo
 - Matlafalang Primary School in Motheo
 - o Tshehetso Primary School in Lejweleputswa
 - o Malebogo Primary School in Lejweleputswa
 - Morena Tshohisi Primary School in Thabo Mofutsanyana
 - o Vogelfontein Primary School in Thabo Mofutsanyana
 - o DR Sello Primary School in Fezile Dabi
 - o Katlego Mpumelelo Primary School in Fezile Dabi
 - o Father Balink Primary School in Fezile Dabi

As we move towards the Provincial Budget Votes in April 2023, further information will be provided and more key initiatives will be highlighted, for implementation within the Free State Province.

We remain poised, to significantly reduce the number of recipients of social security grants and create more jobs and power up our economy. We intend to transform the Free State, into a bread basket of our land.
