1. PURPOSE

- 2. *Projects* for accelerated implementation across all clusters
- 3. Implementation time-lines for priority projects across all clusters, including their spatial reach across **3** *Districts and* **17** *Local Municipalities* in the province.





2. BACKGROUND (1)

- The Mpumalanga Provincial Government (MPG) implements *long term plans* in line with the following strategic plans and frameworks that are informed by the national policy frameworks:
 - 1. Mpumalanga Vision 20230 Implementation Plan Framework,
 - 2. Provincial Spatial Development Framework (PSDF)
 - 3. Mpumalanga Economic Recovery and Reconstruction Plan (MERRP)
 - 4. Revised Provincial 2019-24 Medium Term Strategic Framework (MTSF) etc.
 - 5. District Development Model One Plans from the 3 Districts n the Province
- The MPG develops *Annual Provincial Programme of Action (PPOA*) informed by these key plans and 2023 State of the Province Address (SOPA).





2. BACKGROUND (2)


- The MPG, through the Office of the Premier, monitors this 2023/24 PPOA through the established *cluster system comprised* of the following clusters:
 - Economic Sector, Investment, Employment And Infrastructure Development Cluster (ESIEID Cluster)
 - Governance, State Capacity, Security, Crime Prevention & Institutional Development Cluster (GSCSCPID Cluster)
 - Social Protection, Community And Human Development (SPCHD Cluster)
- The slides below will highlight some of the *key projects priorities for 2023/24 financial year*, with annual budgets and locations where applicable.
- The **9-point-plan approach** was adopted by the Executive Council Lekgotla in February 2023 and announced through 2023 SOPA.

- As at 2022 the estimated population both *Nkangala* and *Gert Sibande increased by* 16% & 13%, respectively
- Notwithstanding a slight growth for *Ehlanzeni* by approximately 5%.
- Overall estimated population for the province has increase by 11%
- The Mpumalanga population is projected to increase, to approximately 5 276 224 by 2030.






5. RECOMMENDATIONS
