Saul).

<u>Advancement:</u> Positive socio-economic impact on the lives of our communities – to address the triple challenges of unemployment, poverty and inequality.



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eGovernment strategy to enhance service delivery aimed at improving production processes and enhancing delivery of public services

The establishment of a Provincial Information Technology Shared Services Centre as a mechanism to deploy the expertise required and to implement technologies for digital transformation for service delivery improvement

Social compacting for upgrading connectivity in the Province:

- Vodacom: R230 Million Expanding broadband coverage in deep rural areas, upgrading base station sites and network resilience.
- MTN: 25 new connectivity sites and modernize 48 sites in our province

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Broadband penetration and network

- Broadband Strategy rollout will be in full swing through its prioritised building blocks for implementation starting 1st April 2023 (SOPA 2023)
- SA Connect: Rollout plan for Phase 2: SA Connect Project will be implemented at one thousand five hundred and ninety nine (1 599) sites for Phase two over the next three years in clinics and schools in our province
- Expanding broadband coverage in deep rural areas, upgrading base station sites and network resilience, 25 new connectivity sites and modernise 48 sites in our province. TOTAL value of Vodacom and MTN: R230 Million:







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Provision of tablets for all GR 12 learners

Provision of internet access to all schools in the province

Operationalisation of the Computer aided Ambulance dispatch system to improve on Emergency Medical Services and response times.

- Phase 1 automate EMS call logging complete and went live Oct 2020.
- Phase 2 Integrating this to ambulance dispatch system
- Phase 3 integration of vehicle location and tracking system

Expand Internet connectivity to clinics and hospitals

• Bokamoso Digital Health Strategy - Public health facilities supplied with adequate ICT infrastructure to implement the Digital Health Strategy 2019 - 2024 of SA.

Biometric Patient management system

- Digitization of existing patient files in selected facilities and health patient registration system
- Electronic patient record keeping







Youth Employment and Youth Development

- Ministry established for improved co-ordination of all youth, women and disability programs
- District Based Interventions for targeted and focused development
- Presidential Youth Employment Initiative: A total of 7 000 youth to be employed
- Transversal Bursary Fund
- Skills plan inclusive of private sector contribution to be response and relevant to the provincial skills demand and sector skills.
- Skills for entrepreneurship development for the reduction of the NEET rate.

Provincial Infrastructure and Maintenance

- Remodeling of DRPW
- Explore increased investment opportunities for catalytic projects boost economic growth and reduce unemployment
- Foster partnerships / multi sectoral coordination to accelerate infrastructure finance and technical support
- Identify quick wins while working towards the re-modelling of the DRPW as part of the turnaround strategy to address infrastructure improvements/maintenance of public infrastructure

Implementation of Insourcing of security and cleaning services







- Interventionist approach is a prerequisite to addressing the unemployment such as Increased investment in sectors with heightened employment multipliers, such as agriculture, manufacturing and tourism must be encouraged.
- Skills development is critical to the diversification of the provincial economy such as
 Develop partnerships with the SETAs to ensure maximum utilisation of services to promote
 skills development in the province. MoAs and MoUs are a possible mechanisms to cement the
 relations and increase uptake. Relevant SETAs must ensure that qualifying youth and school
 leavers are afforded opportunities to participate in apprenticeships and internships, particularly
 in the private sector.
- Energy security is critical for the maintenance of a stable economy and is also important in ensuring growth and development for instance where provincial and municipal government/s to explore the plausibility of installing solar energy infrastructure on public building/s (e.g. schools and government offices) to lessen the burden on the energy grid.



Catalytic Projects aligned to the National Infrastructure Plan – creating economic opportunities and eliminating poverty – through initiatives that entail Education, Heath Services, Social Protection, Skills development and Job Creation

- Namakwa SEZ: Vedanta mine committed a R21 billion rand investment in the Northern Cape. This will generate opportunities for SMMEs. The mine's capacity will be doubled in phase 2, with the construction of a smelter, which will create many downstream opportunities
- Kathu Industrial Park: Implementation: received support from Anglo and Infrastructure South Africa to fast-track implementation
- Upington Industrial Park: Phase one construction starting in the new financial year (2023/24).
- Green Hydrogen
 - Signed a MOU with gthe WCPG to develop a Green Hydrogen Corridor along SADC
 - Future plans entail signing MOU with the EC Government
 - Ubuntu Green Hydrogen Project
- Prieska Power Reserve
- Upilanga Solar and Green H2 Park
- Tyre Granulator facility. R 15 million investment in the establishment of a tyre granulator facility in Kimberley. These granules have a myriad of uses and could be the first step in creating a series of industries linked to the use of this tyre crumb. This project will be launched in May
- Boegoebay Port project
- Vaalharts Revitalization project
- Vaal Gamagara Project 1,7 billion with phase 1 completed.














Economic Reconstruction and Recovery Plan

• SMME support, skills development, investment. Through interactions with minining concluded social compacts in the area of skills development, SMME support and Corporate Social Investment.

IPP Beneficiation

 Rooftop Solar PV - The Province has developed a renewable energy strategy that focuses on rooftop solar PV installation. The strategy seeks to address the limited participation of small, medium and micro-scale enterprises in the renewable energy value chain. The objective is to assist the SMMEs in entering into power purchase agreements with the government and Private sector to acquire loan funding from banks to procure the PV systems

Apprenticeship and learnerships

 Contractor Development Programme - The Province will continue with the Contractor Development programme as part of developing small contractors to compete in the bigger market targeting an intake of 50 small contractors annually into the incubation program

180 Million Rand water project in Hantam

Sol Plaatje municipality interventions

- Focus on addressing bulk water and sanitation challenges at various municipalities. (DWS)
- SPM: 1,9million improve water and sanitation services through the Regional Bulk Infrastructure Grant.

GBVF and Crime:

- Intensify the implementation of the National Strategic Plan on Gender-Based Violence and Femicide
- The Provincial GBVF forum as an inter-sectoral forum to bring all partners on board to reduce gender-based violence in the province in an integrated manner develop and ongoing POA
- Reduction of crime especially violence against vulnerable groups through enhanced crime prevention and combating, inter-sectoral coordination and integrated provincial action plan
- Address funding needs of GBV shelters
- Ensure effective responses to incidents of violence against women and children, eliminate secondary victimisation, and further improve conviction rates.
- Victim Friendly facilities at police stations to be assessed and further equipped to deal with GBVF cases— reduce secondary victimisation
- Utilize the top performing stations for benchmarking in order to upgrade the incapacitated police stations.
- Ensuring functional Thutuzela Care Centres accessible 24/7

Reduce Learner pregnancy:

- Advocate for learner pregnancy prevention among all stakeholders (DOE, DSD, DOH, NGOs) through interventions such as information provision, sexuality, and health education, life skills building, contraceptive counseling and service provision, and the creation of supportive environments
- An interdepartmental collaboration with DOE, DoH and various NGO's working with youth, in the province to strengthen and provide comprehensive adolescent and youth services.

- Nutrition centres 70








